Later in the month, on October 15, we celebrate St. Teresa of Ávila, the great Doctor of the Church and reformer of the Carmelite order. These feasts remind us to remain rooted in prayer, trusting that God works wonders in both the small and great moments of life. May the Rosary, prayed faithfully, lead us ever closer to Christ.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST PAULINUS OF YORK- c.6th Century—10 October 644 A.D.

Paulinus was a Roman monk who joined the mission in Canterbury to convert the Anglo-Saxons in 604 A.D. In 625 A.D. he was consecrated bishop and headed to York in the Kingdom of Northumbria with Aethelburg of Kent who was to marry King Edwin of Northumbria. In 627 A.D. Edwin converted to Christianity and was baptised. Many other important Northumbrians also converted, (including the future St Hilda of Whitby) meaning Paulinus spent 36 days baptising them all. He established a church in York, where he became the first bishop. In c.633 A.D., King Edwin was killed in battle and his kingdom fragmented, leading to many Christians fleeing south as the pagans reasserted control. Paulinus returned to Kent where he became the Bishop of Rochester. He died in 644 A.D.
